Benefits of Makerspaces



Pros

- Equal access to technology
- Builds community through collaboration
- Attracts new people to the library
- Encourages creativity: "everyone is a maker"
- Develops new skill sets
- Community engagement



Cons

- Creation of Makerspace is time-intensive
- Challenge to find space
- Monetary cost involved
- Operating a Makerspace demands staff time





No Staff

- Start small
- Look for opportunities
- Survey current programming
- Gauge staff interest find your champions!

Makerspace Volunteers



Title: Makerspace Volunteer Assistant

Objective: To help with Makerspace during open hours.

Responsibilities:

- Setup and takedown of Makerspace equipment, tables, posters
- Assist patrons with technologies, encouraging co-learning
- Monitor technology to prevent theft and/or breakage

Qualifications:

- Community members with interest and ability in Making
- Enthusiasm and aptitude for engaging with community members
- Positive, flexible attitude
- Ability to adapt to a changing environment

Orientation:

Orientation to the Makerspace will be provided.

Commitment:

- Knowledgeable about SAPL Makerspace service
- Makerspace sessions, 3 hours twice per month (1st Wednesday, 4:30-7:30 & 4th Saturday, 1:00-4:00 each month)

Total time commitment would be between 3-6 hours/month.
